

Kahn is a Professor at the UCLA Institute of the Environment, the Department of Economics, the Department of Public Policy, the UCLA Anderson School of Management and the UCLA School of Law. He is a research associate at the National Bureau of Economic Research and the IZA. He serves as the Research Director at the UCLA Ziman Center for Real Estate. He holds a Ph.D. in economics from the University of Chicago. Before joining the UCLA faculty in January 2007, he taught at Columbia and the Fletcher School at Tufts University. He has served as a Visiting Professor at Harvard, Stanford and the National University of Singapore. He is the author of Green Cities: Urban Growth and the Environment (Brookings Institution Press 2006) and the co-author of Heroes and Cowards: The Social Face of War (Princeton University Press 2008). He is the author of Climatopolis: How Our Cities Will Thrive in the Hotter World (Basic Books 2010). His research areas include; environmental, urban, energy and real estate economics.

This text contains a number of intriguing economic principles relating to the environment, is easy to understand, and very cheap! That being said, this text needs heavy editing. Some examples are weak or the conclusions are arrived at too quickly. The charts and graphs are so elementary. Still, I have a feeling this environment text is much more palatable than its competitors.

this is my review:the book is too chatty and not enough topics covered. I tried to look for disclosure/transparency instruments (e.g. for toxics release inventory etc) and could not find anything in the book beyond the basic urban stuff.

The book is extremely well-written and thoughtful, and it introduces some very complex ideas in the form of intuitive examples. It's thinner on the public choice than I would like and that would've cost it a star, but it gets five stars for a) being available for \$1 (!!), b) for the resources like old exam questions and links to online lectures, and c) for being written in such a way as to appeal to anyone. I suspect that even people who have never studied economics will be able to follow the arguments and examples.
